ATLANTA (Georgia): An im-ATLANTA (Georgia): An im-probable scheme hatched by a 41-year-old millionatre came to life on Sunday when a satelitie started beaming to U.S. viewers their first 24-hour all-news tele-vision network. Mr Ted Turner, an Atlanta broadcasting and sports entrepreneur, is the founder of the Cable News Net-work (C.N.N). The C.N.N.'s first major Interview was with President Jimmy Carter on the West Asia situation. — Reuter.

### Italian P.M. cleared

ROME: The Italian Premier, Mr Francesco Cossiga, was cleared in a narrow vote by a Parliamentary Commission of Enquiry on Saturday of charg-es that he had protected the son of the Christian Democra-tilo Party Vice-President, Mr Carlo Donat-Cattin, from arrest as a terrorist. Nevertheless, Mr Donat-Cattin, resigned from his position on Saturday night as he had offered to do. — A.F.P.

### **Bomb blast**

LONDON: A bomb blasted the offices of the Kuwait oil com-pany in central London on Sun-day, police said. The explosion, which the police said was caus-ed by a bomb weighing about 0.5 kg blasted out the front portion of the building housing the oil company's offices, A poli-ce spokeswoman said it was not yet known if the bomb had been placed inside the building or outside, — Reuter.

**Meeting in Havana** HAVANA: Cuba is consulting other non-aligned countries about holding an extraordinary Ministerial conference of the movement in Havana in July. the Foreign Ministry announc-ed on Saturday. President Fidel Castro became chairman of the 95-member organisation for a three-year term at the summit conference in Havana last Sep-tember. - Requer.

### **Riot** police

JOHANNESBURG: Riot police kept watch on Saturday as South Africans celebrated Re-public Day with no sign that student unrest over racial equality was abating. The po-lice said there was more vio-ience overnight in several areas around Cape Town where stu-dents stoned cars driven by whites and set buildings on fire. — Reuter.
