The Patti constituency from which they contested had a total voting strength of 51,624. The ballot pa-pers of two other candidates are still being counted.

Counting of votes in this border State of the Punjab commenced this morning about four days after the polling in general in all the constituences had concluded. In Ambala City, a Muslim candidate was put up by the Congress without any Muslim voters and with a predominantly refuger vote. The seat has been won by a huge majority by the Congress condidate.



KING FAROUK DISMISSES NAHAS PASHA'S GOVT.

Failure To Maintain Peace And Order In Egypt

CAIRO, Jan. 28.

KING Farouk last night sacked Prime Minister Mustafa El Nahas Pasha and called on Aly Maher Pasha, a former Prime Minister, to form a new Ministry. Maher Pasha, a former Premier, who was once arrested by Nahas Pasha "for security reasons" immediately formed a new Ministry.

CONGRESS GETS MAJORITY

IN MYSORE BANGALORE, Jan. 28.—The Congress which has so far secured 51 Assembly seats in Mysore elections, has ensured for itself absolute majority in the 99-member State Assembly.

Of the 14 results announced to day, the Congress lost two to independents and one to the K.M.P.P.

The first woman candidate to win a seat in Mysore was Mrs. G. L. Subbanna (Congress), who defeated her immediate Socialist rival by a majority of about 8.000 votes. She was elected to the general seat from the Chickmaglur (Mudigere) assembly constituency.

All the six Parliamentary seats so far announced have been captured by the Congress.

According to unofficial sources, the Mysore Finance Minister, Mr. H. C. Dasappa, has secured 1.64.507 votes, out of a total of about four lakh votes polled in the double-member Parliamentary constituency of Mysore District. The counting of votes of his only rival, Mr. M. Gurupadaswamy, (K.M.P.P.) Editor of the Kanarese weekly, "Prajamata" has not yet concluded.—P.T.I.

BRITISH ARMY PREPARED "FOR ALL **EVENTUALITIES**"

ISMAILIA, Jan. 27.—Large convoys of British troops, guns and armoured vehicles were this morning reported to be moving into concentration areas in the Suez Canal zone.

There was no confirmation at Lieutenant General Sir George Erskine's Canal zone headquarters of other reports that the British army was preparing to advance on Cairo or Alexandria to protect British lives and property but usually reliable military sources said that the army was prepared "for all eventualities". Preparation were being made to receive British evacuees from Cairo and other Egyptian towns though all main roads from Cairo are reported to be closed by the Egyptian authorities who are not allowing any British officials or other foreigners to leave the city.

lt was disclosed at the cabi-net meeting that 300 people in-cluding extremists and well-known agitators had been arrest-ed in police action after demon-strators in a day of arson and looting had wrecked the com-mercial area of the city.

It was the second time King Farouk had dismissed Nahas Pasha who was swept into power by an overwhelming vote in general elections in January 1950, the first was in 1944.

Nahas Pasha, with Mr. Anthony Eden, British Foreign Secretary, signed the 1906 Anglo-Egyptian Treaty whose abrogation by Nahas Pasha last October led to the present Anglo-Egyptian cri-sis.

Ever since his election he has led Egyptian nationalist feelings against continuation of the treaty. NEW PREMIER

The Egyptian Premier is 63 and has been a leading figure in Egyptian politics since 1806. He was one of the founders of powerful "Wafd El Misri Nationalist Party in 1919. He was the chief of the royal cabinet in 1805. Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs in 1806 and again from August 1809 to June 1940.

In 1946, he founded the Egyptian Front Movement of which he was the leader. All Maher Pasha is a noted jurist and financier. He was arrested for political reasons in 1942 and released in 1945. His brother Ahmed Maher Pasha who also held post of Egyptian Premier for some time, was assassinated in February 1945.
